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Math Camp Program Overview

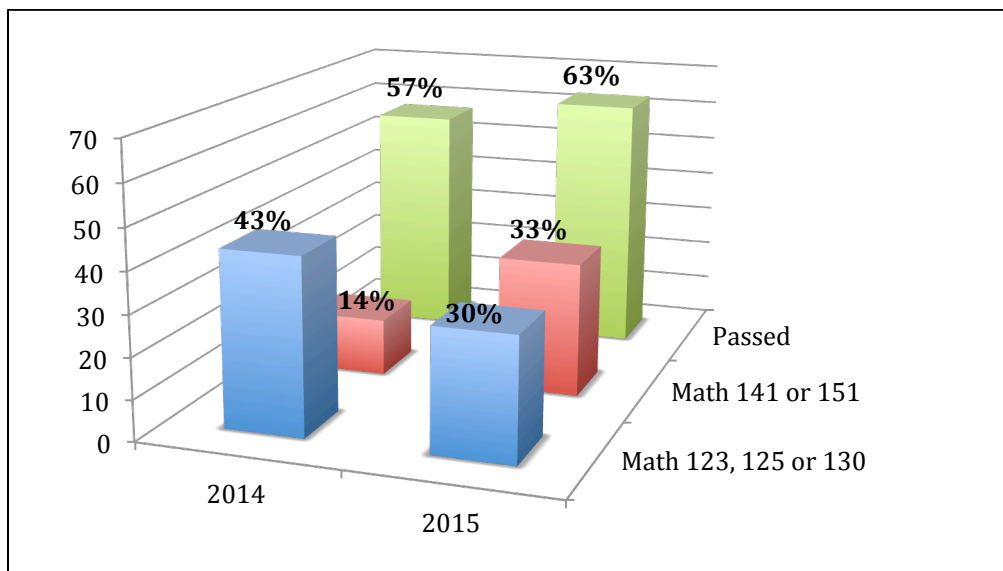
Math camp is an optional, three-week summer program designed to provide a thorough academic review of concepts from Math 119 and 130 – two important pre-requisites for math-intensive majors or other majors requiring certain math skills. Math camp is specifically tailored for students who scored less than 25 on the Math ACT. Math Camp also includes career placement, academic advising, living-learning community, and social engagement to introduce students to UT and ease the transition to college. On the last day of Math Camp, each student will be given an opportunity to take an exam for placement into the required math class for their major.
